## **REPUBLICANS NOMINATE VICTOR MITCHELL FOR HOUSE DISTRICT 45**

### ***Republican candidate unanimously endorsed***

Enthusiastic delegates chose candidate Victor Mitchell, a local businessman and community leader, at the Republican House District 45 Assembly on Saturday, April 15. More than 100 delegates and alternates from both Douglas and Teller Counties gathered at the Douglas County Event Center to cast their votes for the next House District 45 Representative, who will appear on the August 2006 ballot.

Mitchell, who resides in Castle Rock, appears to be their candidate of choice. The incumbent, State Representative Jim Sullivan, had withdrawn from the upcoming race for personal reasons, and he declared his support for Mitchell as well.

Mitchell has campaigned since last July to get on the ballot, crisscrossing the district many times to meet personally with voters in Douglas and Teller counties. He listened to their concerns and suggestions to deal with issues facing the diverse and growing districts.

Nominated by his wife, Amy, the motion was seconded by many, including State Representative Jim Sullivan of Larkspur, Marty Fox of Sedalia, Al Wonstolen of Parker, Dick Lichtenheld of Castle Pines, Robert Pearson and Ron and Susan Frindt of Woodland Park, and Dave Watts, Kathie Shandro, Dave Gill and Mary Anne Greer, all from Castle Rock.

Visibly moved by the unanimous acclaim, Mitchell stated, "I am humbled by all I've heard from you today, and am so excited about the opportunity you are giving me... I promise not to let you down".

Mitchell presented a conservative platform of tax control, insuring more funds in the classroom, strengthening private property rights, controls on illegal immigration, litigation reform and improved financing options for water projects.

Communities in House District 45 include Castle Rock, Cripple Creek, Divide, Florissant, Franktown, Larkspur, Perry Park, Sedalia, The Pinery, Victor and Woodland Park. The November General Election for District 45 Representative to the Colorado General Assembly will decide their next State Representative for the district.
